BULK ITEMS

**Deerfield Township Residents:
Wednesday and Saturday only and
limited to two items per day.
Fees may apply for
Deerfield Township residents not
within the allowed limit per day.**

- Household furniture
- Mattress and box spring = one item
- Table and four chairs = one item
- Hard plastics such as chairs, tables,
coolers, and outdoor playsets
- Chairs and sofas
- Fencing (four sections = one item)
- Wood (4 ft. length, tied, < 50 lbs.)
- Rugs (4 ft. length, tied, < 50 lbs.)
- PVC pipe (4 ft. length, tied, < 50 lbs.)
- Light construction debris
such as toilets, windows, etc.

DO RECYCLE

Rinse containers.
Remove and dispose of caps in trash.



Plastics only #1 and #2

Beverage cartons

Plastic food containers (food removed)

Plastic tubs, trays, pails (#1 and #2)

All glass bottles, containers and jars

Aluminum, steel and tin cans

Empty aerosol cans (remove lid)

All paper

Envelopes (with or without windows)

Cereal boxes

Cardboard (corrugated flattened)

Paperback books

Wrapping paper and tissue paper

Magazines, newspapers and glossy inserts

Junk and unwanted mail

DON'T RECYCLE

No plastic bags! Return to a retail,
grocery or department store.



Trash or plastic bags

Napkins, paper towels and aluminum foil

Paper/plastic plates, cups and utensils

Styrofoam cups, plates and containers

Tire rims and car parts

Pots and pans

Wire clothes hangers

Batteries, light bulbs

Broken glass or mirrors

Tanglers (cords, hoses, etc.)

Rigid plastics (toys, chairs, etc.)

China dishware, glassware and vases

Hazardous waste

All trash must be bagged.
Use tarps to cover open vehicles.

Empty medicine bottles

Windowpane glass pieces

Light bulbs (non-fluorescent)

Aluminum pots and pans

Plates and tableware

Ceramics and crystal

Alkaline batteries AA, AAA, C, D

Latex paint (hardened in can with lid)
